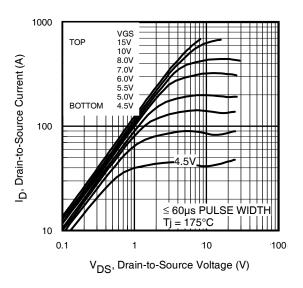
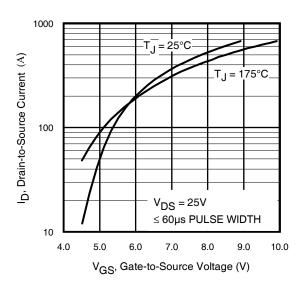


Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics

Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics



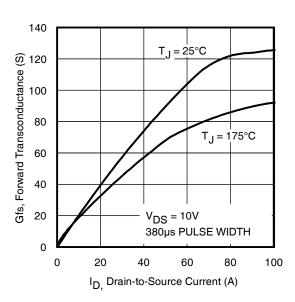
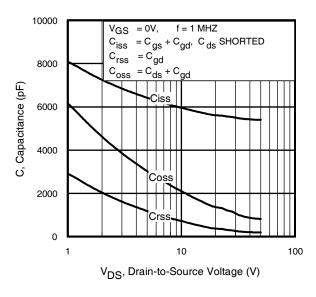
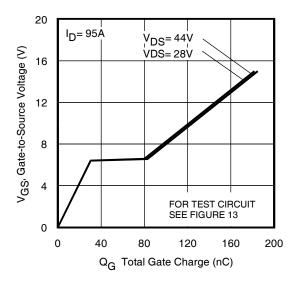


Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics

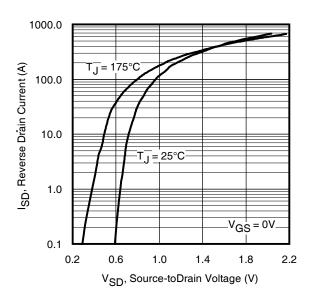
Fig 4. Typical Forward Transconductance Vs. Drain Current

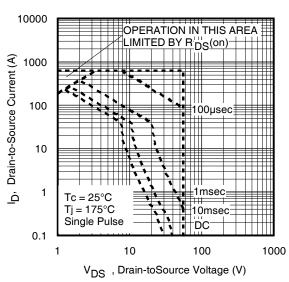




**Fig 5.** Typical Capacitance Vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage

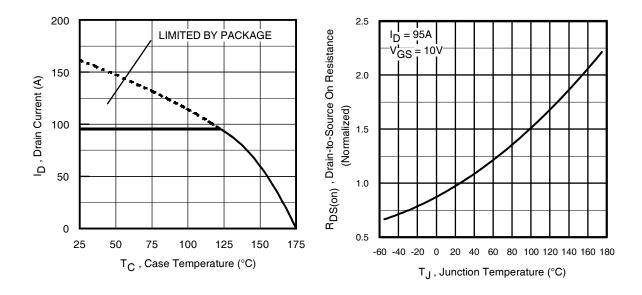
**Fig 6.** Typical Gate Charge Vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage

**Fig 10.** Normalized On-Resistance Vs. Temperature

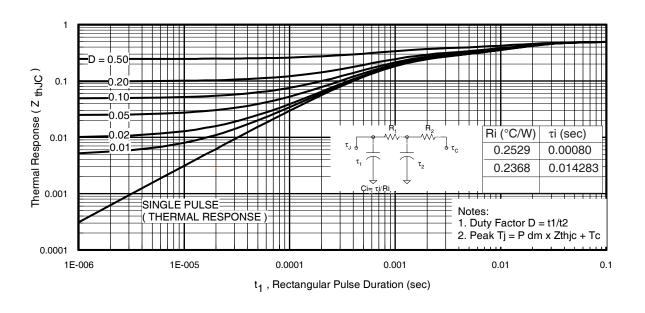


Fig 11. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case

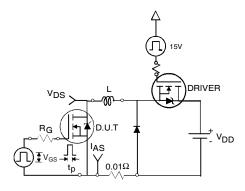


Fig 12a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit

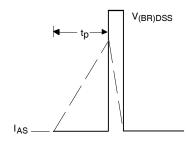


Fig 12b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms

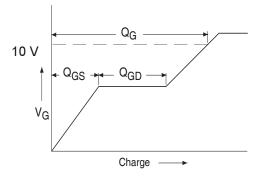
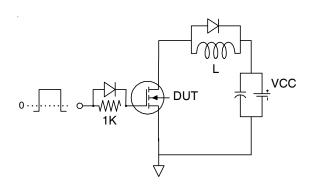


Fig 13a. Basic Gate Charge Waveform

Fig 12c. Maximum Avalanche Energy Vs. Drain Current

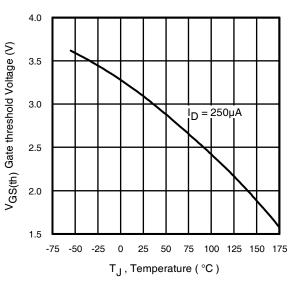


Fig 14. Threshold Voltage Vs. Temperature

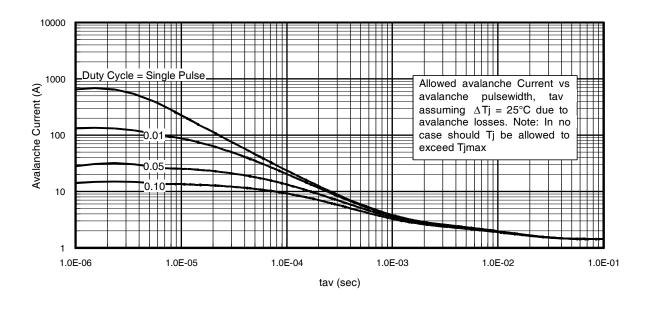
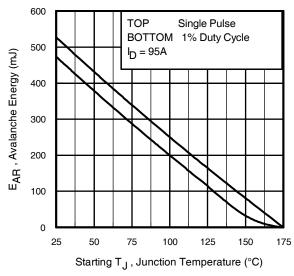


Fig 15. Typical Avalanche Current Vs. Pulsewidth



# Notes on Repetitive Avalanche Curves, Figures 15, 16: (For further info, see AN-1005 at www.irf.com)

- 1. Avalanche failures assumption:
  - Purely a thermal phenomenon and failure occurs at a temperature far in excess of  $T_{jmax}$ . This is validated for every part type.
- 2. Safe operation in Avalanche is allowed as long  $asT_{j\max}$  is not exceeded.
- Equation below based on circuit and waveforms shown in Figures 12a, 12b.
- 4. P<sub>D (ave)</sub> = Average power dissipation per single avalanche pulse.
- BV = Rated breakdown voltage (1.3 factor accounts for voltage increase during avalanche).
- 6. I<sub>av</sub> = Allowable avalanche current.
- 7.  $\Delta T$  = Allowable rise in junction temperature, not to exceed  $T_{jmax}$  (assumed as 25°C in Figure 15, 16).

**Fig 16.** Maximum Avalanche Energy Vs. Temperature

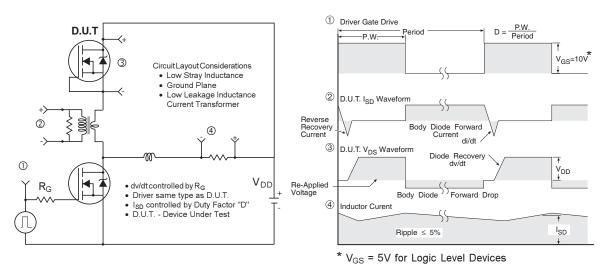


Fig 17. Peak Diode Recovery dv/dt Test Circuit for N-Channel HEXFET® Power MOSFETs

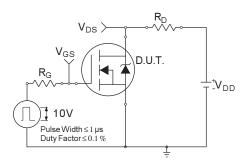


Fig 18a. Switching Time Test Circuit

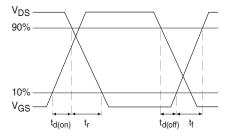
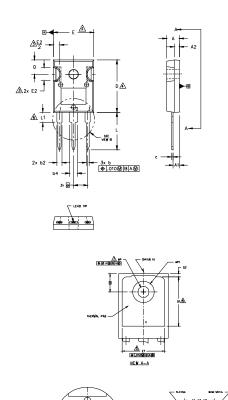


Fig 18b. Switching Time Waveforms

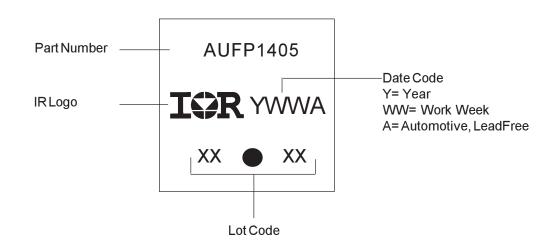
